

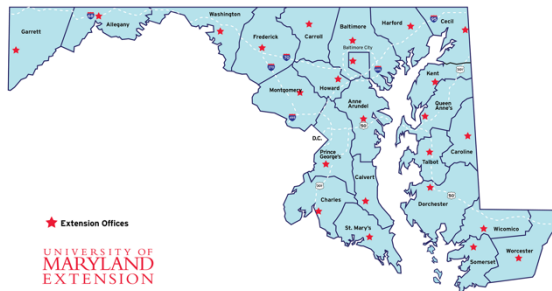

About Marylanders Online

Marylanders Online is a free, statewide program of the University of Maryland Extension (UME) in partnership with the College of Information (INFO) working to promote digital literacy, equity, and inclusion throughout the state of Maryland.

Our Programs Help Marylanders...

- Learn how to use computers, tablets, and cell phones
- Get affordable Internet or locate free Wi-Fi
- Learn digital skills through curated resources, classes, & trainings
- Harness digital opportunities that advance civic participation, economic development, education, healthcare access, and social connection

Western Maryland Cluster

Marylanders Online partnered with county governments, county libraries, and the State Office of Broadband to distribute over 10,000 free Chromebooks through the Maryland Connected Devices Program.

Northern Maryland Cluster

A pilot program funded by UME Marylanders Online graduated 21 inmates nearing release from an intensive six-week curriculum, building their digital literacy, entrepreneurial skills, and vocational readiness.

Eastern Shore Maryland

A partnership with Worcester County 4-H offered a workshop series on website building with AI, combining hands-on digital skills with a critical exploration of AI bias and ethical use.

Central Maryland Cluster

In partnership with the Gilchrist Immigrant Resource Center, 200 individuals took part in a multi-week basic digital skills program, primarily serving low-income, immigrant, and non-English-speaking community members.

Capital Cluster

In partnership with CASA Welcome Centers and the Latino Economic Development Center, digital skills classes are offered to support Latino, Hispanic, and immigrant residents—advancing a multilingual, multicultural workforce through inclusive digital training.

Southern Maryland Cluster

As a registered provider of AARP Senior Planet, Marylanders Online has engaged 354 participants aged 50+ in digital skills programming.

Baltimore City

A cohort of 18 Baltimore City-based Digital Navigators graduated from Pratt Adventure and Beyond program at Enoch Pratt Free Library. This INFO curriculum has since been translated into the MONET open-source curriculum.
