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The 2025 Maryland Digital Opportunity Summit to Convene for Economic Growth and Workforce Innovation

The October 15 event in Silver Spring will spotlight strategies for digital inclusion, economic opportunities, and regional coalition-building.

SILVER SPRING, MD – The public is invited to join state leaders, policymakers, and community advocates at the <u>2025 Maryland Digital Opportunity Summit</u> on October 15, 2025, from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM at the Silver Spring Civic Building. This year's theme, "Investing in Maryland's Future: Invest Today. Empower Tomorrow. Fueling Economic Growth and Workforce Innovation Through Digital Opportunity," underscores the state's commitment to broadband access, digital skills, and equitable economic growth.

The 2025 Summit is open to the public and invites anyone interested in shaping the future of Maryland. Attendees will have the opportunity to engage with experts, participate in discussions, and learn about initiatives driving connectivity and innovation across Maryland. The summit will feature diverse expertise and representation from leading national and statewide organizations, including the Office of Statewide Broadband, the Maryland House of Delegates, LGBT Tech, the National Digital Inclusion Alliance, the Rural Maryland Council, the Urban Institute, Johns Hopkins, and numerous community-based organizations.

To address the core components of digital opportunities, specialized breakout sessions will cover workforce development, infrastructure and broadband access, community engagement, policy advocacy, digital skills training, and innovative local programs.

A Partnership Speed Dating session will facilitate rapid networking connections, followed by coalition-building activities designed to transform initial contacts into actionable regional















partnerships. The Maryland Digital Equity Awards Ceremony will honor outstanding champions in four categories: Navigator, Practitioner, Program, and Workforce. The day will conclude with a networking reception at 4:30 PM, hosted by the <u>Carroll County Technology and Innovation Council</u> and <u>CareerCatchers, Inc.</u>
